New Location News



With praise and thanks to our Lord, we offer a progress report on Reformation's new church location: 601 Madison Road, in Culpeper.

Throughout 2016, the Council and Pastor Brad met frequently with Kemper Quaintance, the Project Coordinator. Kemper has spent many long hours during the construction phase working with Taft (the General Contractor), the Project Architect, engineers, and government building officials. There have been numerous challenges along the way, requiring adaptation and time to address. We are now proceeding at a good rate.

- The building interior is 12,000 sq. feet., almost twice our current space. The lot is approx. 3 acres, including 112 dedicated parking spaces, plus green space for outdoor activities, a playground, or future additional parking.
- The new Sanctuary is rated to seat up to 245 people, and the Fellowship Hall 176, more than double our current capacities. We also have 'The Place', which can seat 140.

- RLC's current lease has been extended though February, 2017, although the Landlord unexpectedly retained our former Fellowship Hall and The Place. At our new location, we will have a 10-year lease, with the opportunity to purchase, or to extend the lease. The initial lease amount will be approx. the same as our current cost, but with almost twice the space.
- The primary renovations and new addition construction is being done and paid for by the property owners, who are represented by Kemper Quaintance. The finished building will be ready for the church to personalize with furnishings, new appliances, and other specific needs. Reformation's Ministry Leaders have inspected the building, and are working on their areas of responsibility.
- The Project Architect and engineers have worked intensely with the Town of Culpeper and Culpeper County. They had to wait for several months to receive permits for the site work required on the rest of the property.
- The owners responded to Reformation's request for additional space, and re-designed

- Our Ministry Committees are prepared to meet the 'soft costs' that will be Reformation's responsibility, such as specific storage cabinetry, phone & computer network technology, audio/visual systems, window coverings, etc.

As the Construction Phase nears completion, additional input and assistance from our Ministry Committees will be required. Please be ready to respond when the call goes out!
